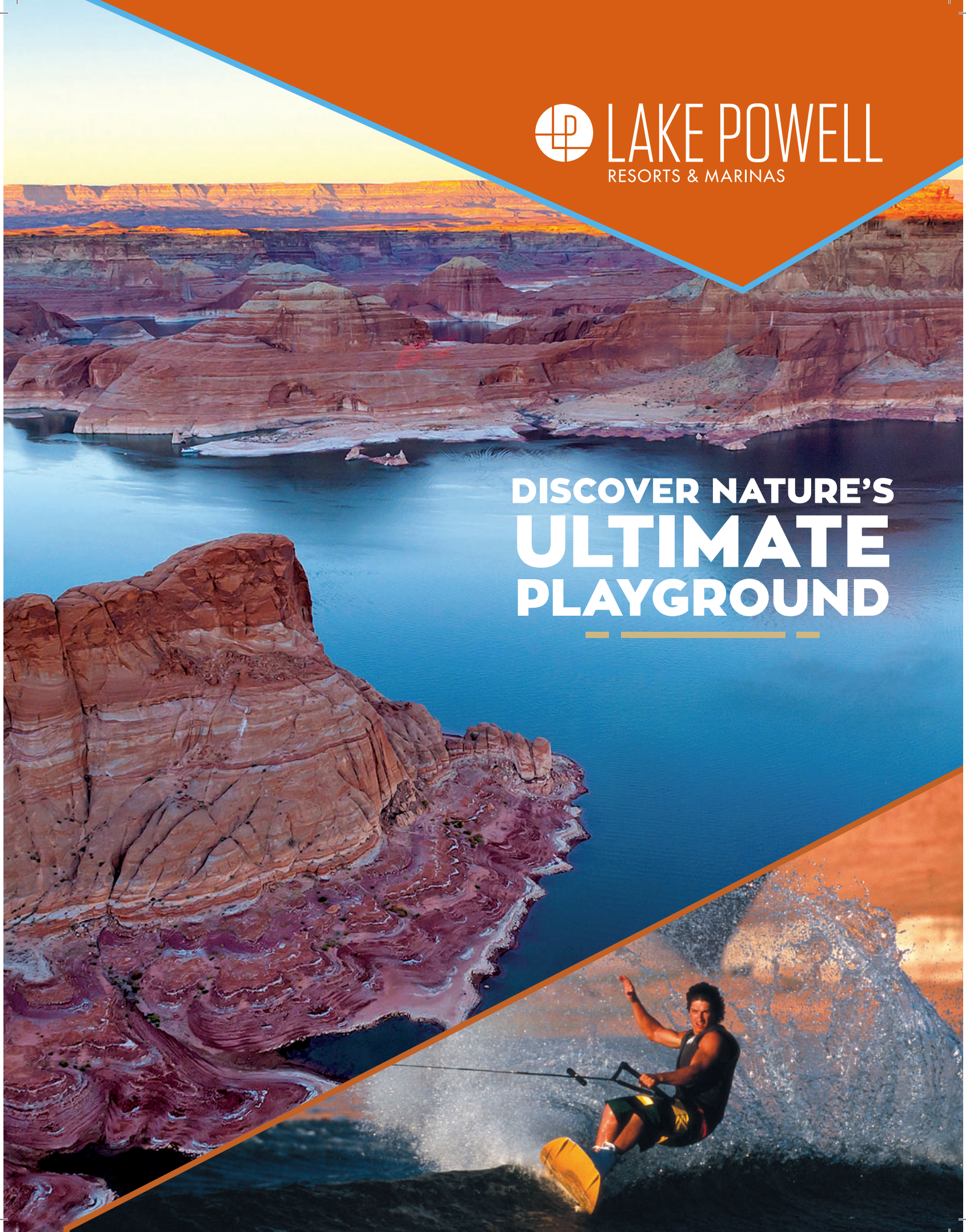

ADVENTURE LIVES ON THE LAKE

With over 2000 miles of shoreline, lots of side canyons to explore, and ample opportunities for water sports, it's no wonder that Lake Powell is known as the ultimate playground. Lake Powell stretches from northern Arizona up into southern Utah and most hotels, dining, and activities are split into Lake Powell North and Lake Powell South. No matter if you're coming for the down lake activities or want to spend your time up lake, you're going to find an abundance of activities to get your adrenaline pumping or can simply spend your time enjoying nature.

HISTORY

Lake Powell was formed in 1963 when the Glen Canyon Dam held back the waters of the Colorado River. The lake is filled with clear, blue waters and surrounded by sandstone walls. While the lake was formed in 1963, it took 17 years to fill the lake to the high watermark. Once full, Lake Powell became the second-largest man-made lake. Lake Powell is named after Major John Wesley Powell, who charted most of the surrounding area on two expeditions in 1869 and 1872.



LODGING



LAKE POWELL NORTH ACCOMMODATIONS/LODGING:

- **Defiance House Lodge** - Located in Bullfrog, Utah across the lake from Halls Crossing Marina, you'll find Defiance House Lodge. At the hotel, you'll find on-site dining, WiFi, gift shop, walking trails, and marina, dock, and lake access. This hotel is pet-friendly.
- **Family Units** - If you're traveling with a big group, you'll love the Family Units at Bullfrog and Halls Crossing Marinas. Each family unit has three bedrooms, two bathrooms, a fully equipped kitchen, a picnic table, and a propane grill.
- **Houseboating** - For a true adventure, you can live on the waters of Lake Powell. Rent a houseboat at Bullfrog Marina and have all of the comforts of home, with beds, living space, a full kitchen, and a great sound system.
- **RV and Camping** - Pull in or set up your tent at the Bullfrog RV & Campground and Halls Crossing RV & Campground. At the Bullfrog campground, you'll find 18 pull-through spaces and 4 back-in spaces with full hook-ups. Campground amenities include bathrooms, showers, charcoal grills, and picnic tables. Pets are allowed on-leash at Bullfrog campground. Amenities at the Halls Crossing RV & Campground include 31 pull-through spaces for RVs, full hook-ups, charcoal grills, and picnic tables. For tent campers, you'll find 41 primitive sites with fire pits, bathrooms, and showers. Pets must be leashed at all times.

LAKE POWELL SOUTH ACCOMMODATIONS:

- **Lake Powell Resort** - Located in Page, Arizona, Lake Powell Resort is the perfect headquarters for your Lake Powell adventures. The hotel has amenities such as on-site dining options, two swimming pools, a hot tub, sauna, fitness center, gift shop, and WiFi.
- **Houseboating** - Rent a houseboat and you can spend your entire vacation on the water. Houseboats are available from Wahweap Marina. Each houseboat has comfortable beds, a living space, a full kitchen, and a great sound system.
- **Wahweap RV & Campground** - At the Wahweap RV & Campground, you can rent a space for your RV or tent. Choose from full hook-up RV sites, tent-only sites, and group campsites. Campground amenities include laundry facilities, showers, bathrooms, WiFi, picnic tables, and fire rings.



DINING

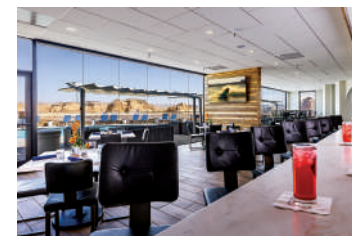
DINING IN LAKE POWELL NORTH:

- **Anasazi Restaurant** - At Defiance House Lodge, you'll find the Anasazi Restaurant where you can get home-style breakfasts and hearty lunch options such as burgers, sandwiches, salads, and soups. For dinner, choose between entrees such as fresh fish, pasta dishes, and steak. While you eat, be sure to take in the spectacular lake views.



DINING IN LAKE POWELL SOUTH:

- **Rainbow Room** - The Rainbow Room is located onsite at the Lake Powell Resort. The restaurant serves breakfast, dinner, and fantastic lake views. For dinner, you can choose from entrees such as fresh fish, flame-broiled beef, or an herb-roasted cauliflower "steak."
- **Latitude 37** - Located at Wahweap Marina, Latitude 37 is accessible by land or water. Whether you're dining inside or on the rooftop balcony, you're going to be able to take in extraordinary views of Lake Powell, Wahweap Bay, Castle Rock, and Navajo Mountain. The restaurant serves burgers, sandwiches, salads, and pizza.



- **Wind** - In the lobby of the Lake Powell Resort, you'll find Wind Coffee. On your way out the door for an adventure, you can get coffee, tea, and grab-and-go food options.
- **Driftwood Lounge** - If you're looking for a cozy atmosphere, great views, and a cocktail to sip on, head over to the Driftwood Lounge at Lake Powell Resort. While you're there, you can also order up some light bites and pub fare.



ACTIVITIES



BOARD FOR A BOAT TOUR:

Head over to Wahweap Marina in Lake Powell South for a guided boat tour. Choose between these tours to find the one that's right for you:

- **Navajo Canyon Tour** - This 3-hour tour takes you to see Glen Canyon Dam and through Navajo Canyon where you can admire the bands of colors in the sandstone walls.

If you're interested in a unique boat tour, you can book a private tour of Lake Powell South or Lake Powell North.



DINNER CRUISE:

Board the Canyon Princess at Wahweap Marina and embark on an evening adventure full of scenery and a scrumptious meal. Your meal includes salad, bread, dessert, and your choice of three different entree options. You can purchase your drinks at the bar.



WILDERNESS RIVER ADVENTURES HORSESHOE BEND RAFTING TRIP:

Join Wilderness River Adventures for a half-day, family-friendly river rafting tour that takes you to see Glen Canyon Dam, Petroglyph Beach, Horseshoe Bend, and Lees Ferry. Bring your sense of adventure, we'll bring the water and lemonade.



FISHING:

A favorite pastime at Lake Powell is to sit back, relax, and cast a line. At Lake Powell, you'll find smallmouth bass, largemouth bass, striped bass, walleye, channel catfish, crappie, and bluegill. Be sure to get your fishing license before you arrive in Lake Powell.



HIKING:

Lake Powell is home to some of the most amazing hikes in the American Southwest. You'll find trails for all ranges of hikers in both North and South Lake Powell. Be sure to bring plenty of water and your camera so you can take in the magical landscape and beautiful sites surrounding Lake Powell.



STARGAZING:

In 2018, Rainbow Bridge was designated an International Dark Sky Place, meaning there's minimal light pollution and some of the best star viewing you've ever seen. With no big cities nearby, you'll be able to see up to 15,000 stars, tons of constellations, planets, and maybe even a meteor shower.



SEASONAL

While summer is the favorite time to visit Lake Powell for its warm weather and sunshine, the lake is open year-round and sees tourists during every season.



SPRING:

Springtime in Lake Powell is when the snow starts to melt and the water levels begin to rise. The air temperatures remain cool, but you won't see many tourists out on the lake. If you're interested in fishing, this is the perfect time of year to visit.



SUMMER:

Summer in Lake Powell is the prime time to visit. With long, sunny days and warm waters, you'll spend your whole day out on the lake. The long, warm days are perfect for water sports such as skiing, wakeboarding, swimming, and kayaking. In the evening, you can watch the breathtaking sunsets and set up for some stargazing.



FALL:

Fall is the shoulder season at Lake Powell. The lake water retains its warmth but the nights start to cool off. With less boat traffic on the water and fewer people, you'll have the trails to yourself and can get the best fishing spots.



WINTER:

Winter in Lake Powell is a time of tranquility. If you're looking to slow down and get close to nature, this is the perfect time of year to visit. Fishing, houseboating, and hiking are all still available in the winter. Winter temperatures may drop below freezing at night, but the days remain warm with highs in the upper 40s and 50s.

EVENTS CALENDAR:

Each year in November, hot air balloon pilots flock to Lake Powell for the Lake Powell Balloon Regatta. With 4 days of flying, education programs at local schools, and a street fair, this is a must-see event.



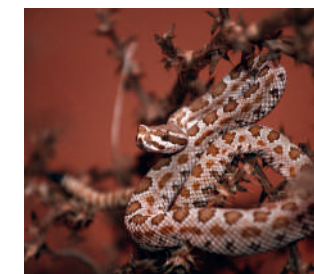
SUSTAINABILITY ACTIONS:

At Lake Powell, we take sustainability seriously and consider taking care of the environment as part of our duty. To do our part, we work towards being more sustainable by:

- Sourcing food from local, sustainable places.
- Conserving energy with LED lights, equipping houseboats with solar panels, using sensors to turn off and on lights, and building buildings with sustainable materials.
- Conserving water by using low-flow faucets, and transitioning 70% of landscaping to xeriscape which reduced water use by 38 million gallons in one year.
- Minimizing waste by offering houseboats to NPS coordinated volunteers to clean up the shoreline of Lake Powell and using suppliers who offer minimal packaging and bulk purchasing.
- Reducing emissions by working with delivery drivers to optimize our delivery schedule and using electric-powered housekeeping carts.

WILDLIFE VIEWING:

Lake Powell and Glen Canyon National Recreation Area are home to a wide variety of flora and fauna. During your stay, you'll see a number of different bird species, tons of endangered and sporting fish, and lots of reptiles and amphibians. You might also see large mammals such as bobcats, bighorn sheep, and coyotes.



PLAN YOUR ADVENTURE

PACKING LIST:

When you're getting ready for your trip to Lake Powell, you'll want to check the weather before you go. While the days get hot in the summer, the nights stay cool year-round. Be prepared with sweatshirts and dress in layers, no matter what time of year you visit. In the winter, the days will stay sunny and warm, but the temperatures can dip below freezing at night. The best part about Lake Powell: it rarely rains, so you can leave the rain gear at home. But, be sure to bring plenty of sun protection so you can stay out all day on the water. If you're planning to fish, be sure to bring as much of your gear as possible because there are no gear rentals nearby.



PARK ENTRANCE FEES:

Lake Powell is part of the Glen Canyon Recreational Area. To enter, you'll need to pay a small fee. Each pass is for 1 to 7 days. If you plan to stay longer than 7 days, you'll need to renew your pass. Different passes include:

- Private, non-commercial vehicle
- Motorcycle
- Individual on foot or bike
- Child 15 or younger
- Boat

FEE-FREE DAYS:

A few days each year, the National Park Service waives all entrance fees to the national parks.

DAY OF ARRIVAL A MOMENT TO SETTLE

-  Check-in to Lake Powell Resort
-  Enjoy a meal in the Rainbow Room while you take in spectacular lake views
-  Get a good night's rest in your cozy room






1ST FULL DAY LAKE ADVENTURES

-  Start your morning with a hearty breakfast from the Rainbow Room Restaurant
-  Head over to Wahweap Marina to rent a powerboat and any water toys you'll need for the day
-  Spend the day waterskiing across the lake or finding small side canyons that you can hike or paddleboard up



2ND FULL DAY GET CLOSE TO NATURE

-  Start your day early with a morning hike to Horseshoe Bend or take a river rafting tour to see it from below
-  Head to Wind to grab some coffee, tea, or grab and go snacks to fuel up for the second half of the day
-  Finish the day with light bites and a cocktail at the Driftwood Lounge

FAVORITE SOUVENIR:

Throughout Lake Powell, you'll find gift shops and convenience stores where you can get anything you need. Whether you're looking for a souvenir to take home and remember your trip with or forgot something at home, you can find exactly what you need. You'll also be able to find grab-and-go meals that are perfect for hiking.

GETTING HERE

Lake Powell is all about being outside. As such, most visitors to Lake Powell drive in so they can bring all their camping, fishing, and boating gear. If you are planning to fly into Lake Powell, you can get a flight to Page Municipal Airport. You'll find connections to Page Municipal Airport from Phoenix and Las Vegas airports. Once you arrive, you can rent a car from Page Municipal Airport and head over to Lake Powell. From the airport, it's a 20-minute drive to Lake Tahoe South.
