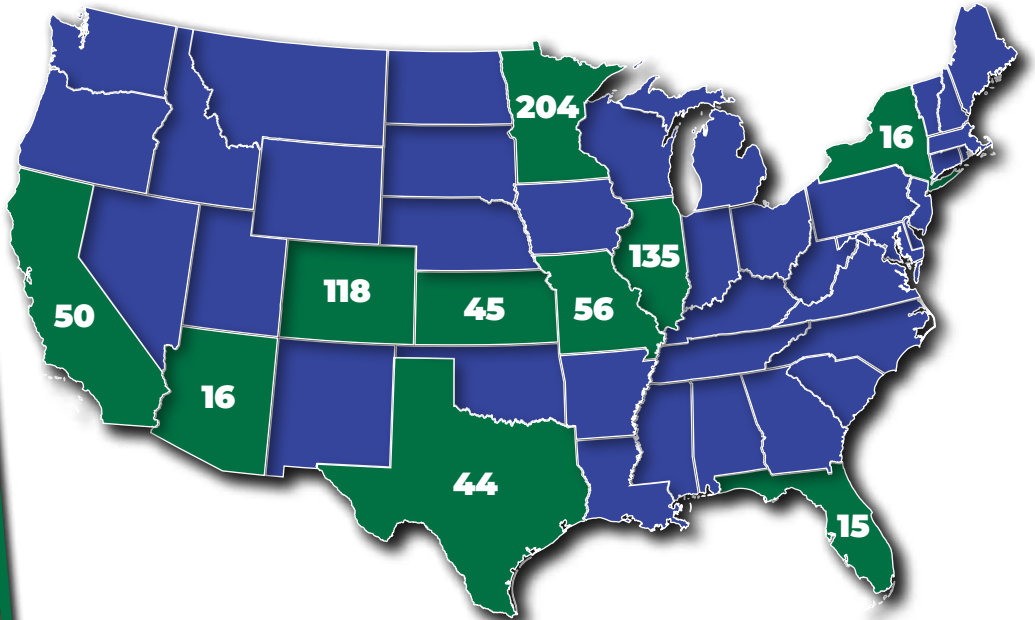

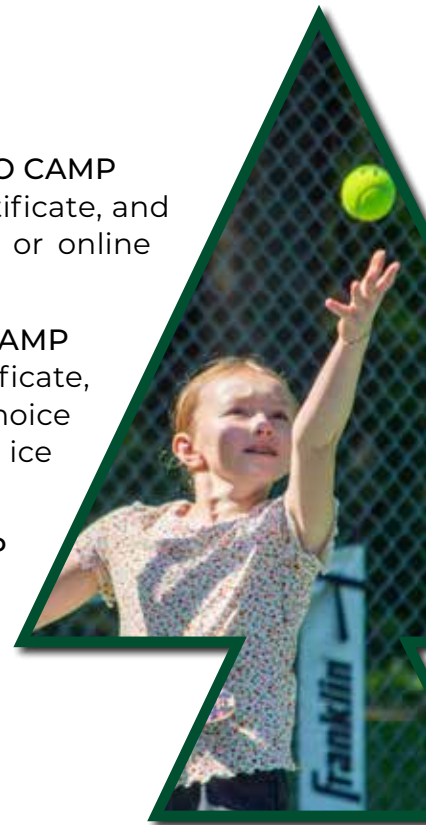

LT REFLECTION

GUS GENEVOIS

I have always considered camp to be my home away from home, as it is special in so many ways. Camp Lincoln is a place I will always cherish as it has molded me into the person I am today. I joined the Camp Lincoln Family back in 2023 as a Senior and as a first-generation camper. I must say that summer was nothing but a thrill and purely a fantastic experience. However, then, not having heard much about the LT Program, I thought my adventures at camp would end on Departure Day. During my final evening at camp, I was a wreck as I realized that my final moments at camp were occurring and that I would have to leave this wonderful community behind just a couple of hours later. Behold to my surprise when all the current LT-1s came down to the Senior Dock to personally encourage us to apply to be LT-1s the next summer and to be a vital part of

what makes camp special. During our conversations, I was given but a glimpse of what being an LT was, and yet, I was completely enthralled. As an LT-1, I would be able to come back to camp, yes, but most importantly, I would get to be part of what camp represents, which was upholding our values and making sure that others were able to experience the same thrill I did as a camper.

One of the first things I told my parents when I came home from camp that summer was that I wanted to become an LT this past summer. After multiple discussions and a surprisingly demanding and intense application process, I received that coveted acceptance email that would introduce me to maybe the most special and impactful three-and-a-half weeks of my life. Things were not going to be as easy as they seemed because, on my departure morning from France, I found out that my flight had been canceled. Being from across the Atlantic, there would not be any other reasonable flight for me to take until the next morning, making me late for the first evening of the LT Program. My summer had gotten off to a bad start, but after a grueling 24 hours without sleep, I once again found myself back at camp, happy as ever. I was warmly welcomed by all my fellow LTs and the LT Directors which I now call my lifelong friends. As I finally entered the cabin, I faced the consequences of my late arrival. Despite lacking sleep and not having unpacked, I sat down and started catching up on the late assignments that were due that same evening, finally falling asleep on the couch.

The next morning was Camper Arrival Day! I was tired, but I truly believe that it set me on track to face the demands of the LT Program while erasing my greatest fear of not fully realizing that I was no longer a camper but an LT. From Day 1, I was motivated to work to make camp as special as it was for me as a camper. Many things were asked of us as LTs, from being role models to campers, leading and mastering camp activities, organizing camp's mainstream events, and finally writing essays and other assignments. Completing all these tasks led us to learn to manage a tight schedule that not everyone in our shoes could handle. Although there were some late work nights, doing such work led to some amazing and rewarding experiences and some incredible personal growth and development. An entire essay would not be able to capture all these moments, but one can only do his best.

As a recap, one's role as an LT is beneficial to the LT, but also to all those around him. As an LT, you mature intellectually, but also socially. Through the intense work required, I understood the importance of being calm, consistent, and organized. Throughout my time at camp, I was able to become better at all of these skills. I honed my intellectual abilities, preparing myself for life ahead and all the work that was to come with it. However, this also led me to effectively make camp's activities and events smoother and more enjoyable for all the campers, hopefully making their summer even better than it already was. With the journal reading and my time spent with the campers, I was able to hone my social skills as an LT. I learned the primary qualities of a role model and was able to use them firsthand, making me become a better person, capable of dealing with any situation, but most importantly, being there to help others. As such, I worked hard to be there for all the campers, aiding their personal growth, being a helping hand for any obstacle they had to face, and helping them learn how to become that helping hand, too.

As the program went on, my LT-1 group became closer and more tightly knit than ever. I would say that we almost became inseparable and lifelong friends. I will always cherish that one final evening when we all came together on the athletic field and sat there reflecting on the summer, under the stars. This was one incredible, final bonding moment.

Departure Day came, as always, bitter-sweet, but this time, we came back home to our parents as different people, grown, mature, and more capable of facing life than ever before. This, however, was not the end of the LT-1 experience, as even today, I still use the skills I gained this past summer in school and during my everyday life. My time as an LT-1 has immensely helped me in terms of organization and facing my procrastination issues. Camp Lincoln has made me more consistent and determined than ever and has helped me tackle my Junior year of high school with ease. Outside of school, I have built a healthier relationship with my little sister, putting our differences on the side and enjoying our time together. In my local community, I have taken more of a leading role, helping to guide my peers and making the activities we do in it more enjoyable for all those involved. An example of this would simply be my role as a youth soccer coach and referee where through the values of camp and the skills I learned as an LT, I now guide young kids to be the best versions of themselves while giving them an enjoyable and purposeful time.

I am forever grateful for my time as an LT-1 this past summer as it molded me into who I am today. It was truly an incredible experience that has given me some lifelong skills and some of the best of friends. I miss camp with all my heart and hope that all future LTs will be able to have the same experience as I did. My advice to the next group of LT-1s is to keep making camp special and know that the program will make you a better leader at camp, at home, in your community, and at school.

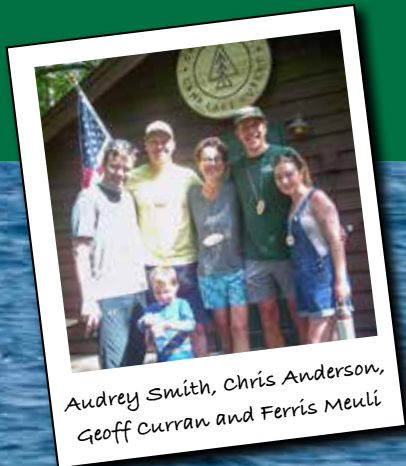

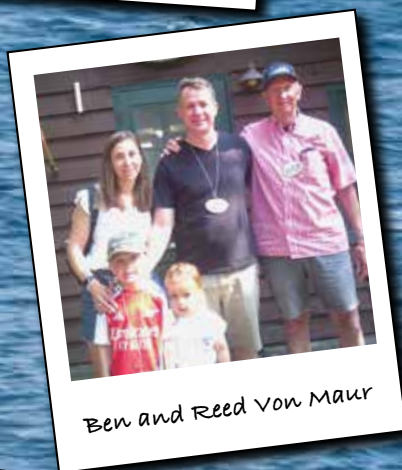

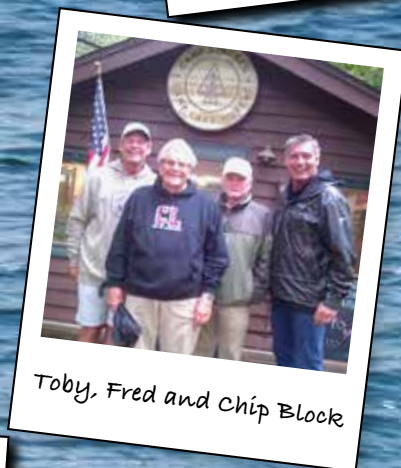
