During the course of my experience I was nominated a co-captain for the green team during color wars. As a color wars captain I had the opportunity to lead an amazing group of girls. From the first meeting to the breaking of the first string CLT was on fire. Girls proudly sported their colors of green and white not only through their clothing, face paint, and even hair but through the non-stop chanting and cheering on of their teammates. It was a day not only filled with running, dribbling, hula hooping, and zip lining, but of laughter, friendship, and discovery. After waiting in anticipation for a green flag to wave high above the tree house, we canoed to the beach with our hearts pounding in our throats. We beached the canoe, threw off our life jackets, ignited the fire and somewhere in between the cheers of white and green, Annie and Laura, Ellen and Montana, I came to realize what my summer as an LT was all about. Tennis Camp

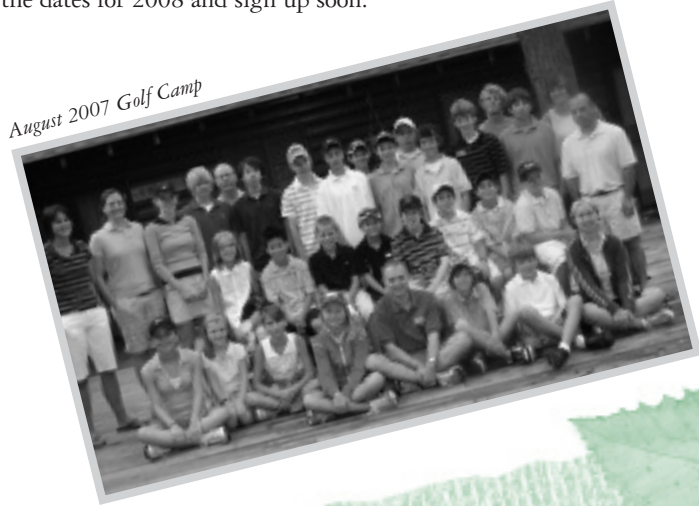

I remember the time when talking to a classmate made my stomach rumble with nerves. I remember eyeing the High Ropes Course at Camp Lake Hubert, and whispering to a fellow counselor - 'not even for a million dollars'. I remember a time when I was a different person.

My time at Camp Lincoln changed everything; I can drive motorboats, sing songs, perform magic tricks, lead camp-fires, shoot shotguns, talk about anything with anyone, cure homesickness, talk Spanish, play chess, spot poison ivy, and do the Kingfisher Handshake blindfolded. Camp Lincoln taught me that with courage, and a little bit of practice, you can do anything.

If a couple of weeks at Camp Lincoln can drastically transform myself, a settled 20 year old University student, then picture the changes it can induce within the mind of a shy 12 year old. Can you imagine the magical results? I don't have to imagine. I saw it every day of my summer.

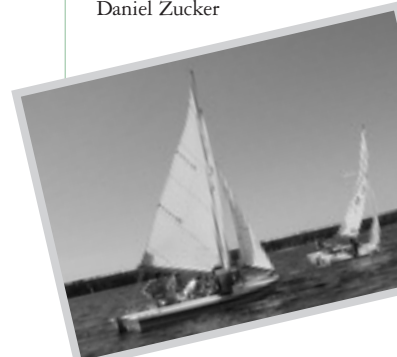
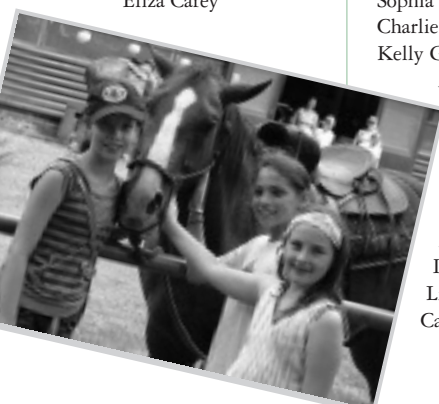

Ever dream of those amazing campfire meals from Outdoor Cooking Class at camp? Well, here are a couple of ideas that you can do at home. Although these recipes do not bring the smell of the campfire into your home, hopefully the fun of making these yummy treats will bring back lots of great summer memories!

Recipe for: Banana Boats

- Banana
- Chocolate
- Marshmallows
- Tinfoil

Directions: Leave banana in peel. Slice it horizontally, (Not fully through, only through top of banana and peel! NOT IN HALF). Open it up and put in chocolate and marshmallows. Wrap in tinfoil and heat in the oven or over a fire.

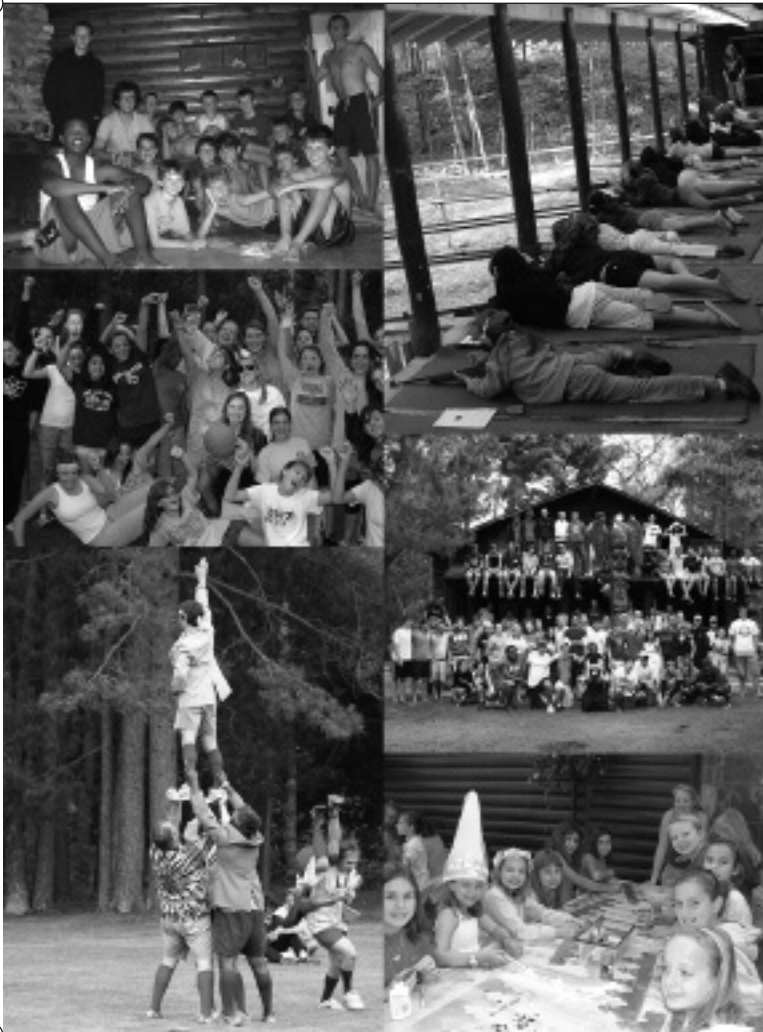
