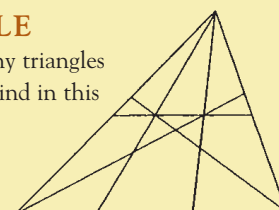

## 2008 SESSIONS AND DATES

### TRADITIONAL CAMP

Sessions I & II are our four week traditional camp sessions, with a legacy dating back to our founding days in the early 1900's. Campers in our four week sessions participate in seven 3-day blocks, totaling 21 days of self-chosen activities. Sessions I & II are focused on developing technical proficiency in campers' chosen activities as well as forming life-long friendships with cabin mates and staff, plus wilderness trips, increasing outdoor skills and confidence in the Great Northwoods. Sessions I & II are available for current 2nd through 11th graders.

Coed Camp is a 10 day session modeled after our traditional camps, but with both boys and girls at Camp Lincoln. Coed Campers participate in three 2 or 3 day blocks, totaling 8 days of self-chosen activities. Campers find that this session is a great way to complete their summer and to head into the school year with a positive and energized attitude. This Camp is available for current 2nd through 8th graders.

### PREP CAMP I-IV

Prep Camp is our two week program, serving as an introduction to our longer term traditional camps. 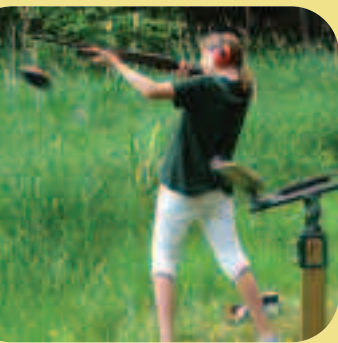
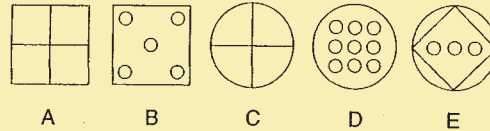

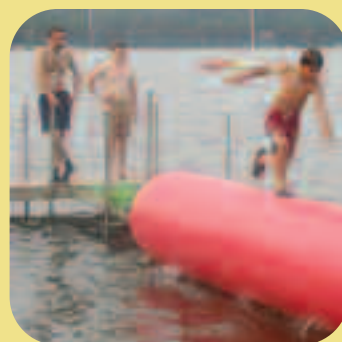

## DNR COMPLETES AUGUST FISH SURVEY ON LAKE HUBERT

The camp has been a member of the Lake Hubert Conservation group and values the support this group has given for helping to make Lake Hubert such a terrific lake.

The Department of Natural Resources fish biologist team completed a major survey in August 2007 and Tim Brastrup and David Bohlander, both stated that Lake Hubert is in overall good shape as one of the premier fishing lakes in the area. Surveying indicated a “healthy walleye population for a lake of this

nature and above average populations of crappies and bass.” The walleyes are reportedly above average in size, but “hard to catch due to the water clarity of Lake Hubert.”

We are excited about this resource for our camp fishing programs where we practice catch and release.

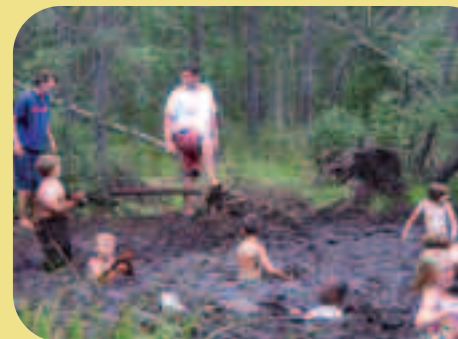

## NATURAL GIFTS OF CAMP

Every summer, when I was in junior high and high school, my buddy Pete would disappear for a few weeks to a camp. I resented it. For me, those humid July weeks back in Kansas dragged, and then Pete would come home telling tales of adventure — as if he had been to some lake Oz.

As it turns out, that camp shaped Pete in ways neither of us realized at the time. He credits his summers at camp with giving him a foundation for success and longevity — more than three decades — as a teacher.

“The camp encouraged me to invent activities, such as pioneering, survival hikes and overnights, and identifying native plants,” he says. “I also encountered brown bears, and wolves .Only the kids with me believed me.”

One more reason I wished I could have gone to summer camp with him.

Today, too few children and young people experienced camp. In my book, *Last Child in the Woods*, I describe how young people can likely tell you about the Amazon rain forest, but they'll likely be hard pressed to describe the last time they explored the woods in solitude or lay in a field listening to the wind and watching the clouds move. Nature is becoming an abstraction, something to watch on the flip-down TV screen from the back seat of a minivan.

In 2005, "Generation M: Media in the Lives of Eight- to Eighteen-Year-Olds," conducted by the Kaiser Family Foundation, revealed that children are plugged into some kind of electronic medi-

um an average of five-and-a-half hours a day, “the equivalent of a full-time job, and more time than they spend doing anything else besides sleeping.”

One reason kids aren't going outside as much is parental fear. News and entertainment media have conditioned us to believe that life outside the front door is far more dangerous than it actually is, at least from stranger-danger. Nonetheless, this fear is unlikely to go away, which is one of the reasons parents are likely to value camps even more in the future than they do today. Risk is always a part of life, but camps can offer parents the reassurance that their children will be safe as they receive the gifts of nature.

The physical benefits are obvious; others are more subtle but no less important. For example, research shows that nature experiences significantly reduce children's stress. Free play in natural areas enhances children's cognitive flexibility, problem-solving ability, creativity, self-esteem, and self-discipline. Effects of Attention Deficit Disorder are reduced when children have regular access to the out-of-doors.

Children are simply happier and healthier when they have frequent and varied opportunities for experiences in the out-of-doors.

Clearly there's more to camp than s'mores. Pete could have told us that. In fact, he did.

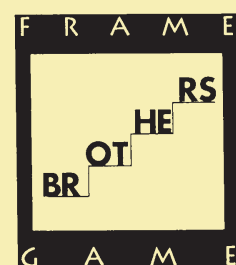

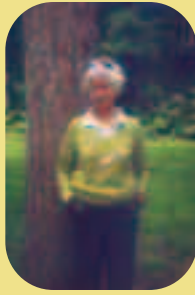




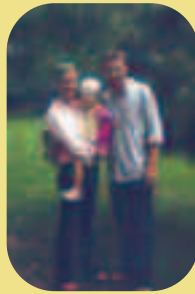

We are pleased that Marty Gitchell has picked up this important role for our camp operation.



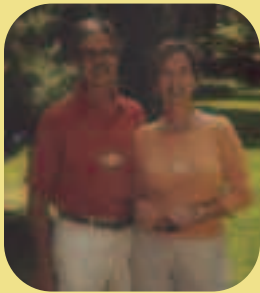

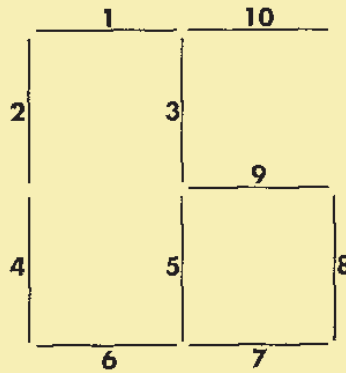
