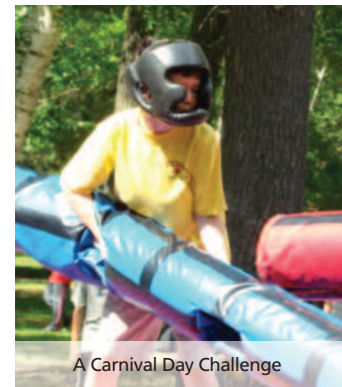

CAMP LAKE HUBERT

- Orioles Cabin has been totally remodeled with a new bathroom, expanded center room, expanded upstairs chalet, new entrance way and new upper deck.
- Happy Hollow Cabin has two new remodeled bathrooms with bright new lights, large mirrors and built in sinks with hot water. The center rooms were also remodeled.
- There will be several new mountain bikes available to add to our fleet of bikes. We added some more of the smaller sizes, too, which worked so well last year.
- Our new craft shop built last year now has an expanded deck area for doing lots of crafts outside, too. We have also added several more rope swings at Camp Lake Hubert.
- If you have ever wanted to play guitar, this is your year at Camp Lake Hubert and Camp Lincoln. We have purchased guitars and have a staff member who will give lessons so we can add music to the camp songs.
- Down at the CLH Waterfront, you will be able to see our own new "Swan," a double decker pontoon boat. Evening activities can now include using this new boat to go to the center of the lake and jump off the second deck. Get ready to do some giant cannonballs. We are even looking at adding a water slide to the second deck.
- Added to the creative part of CLH will be a new Creative Writing Program to choose for one of your sign-up activities.
- We will be offering a new Yoga Program too, so bring your yoga mat if you have one. We will also have some at camp if you are interested and do not have your own mat.
- There are lots of other additions for equipment in sailing, windsurfing, crafts, archery, riflery, and wilderness areas. A new sailboat arrived last fall to help update our fleet.

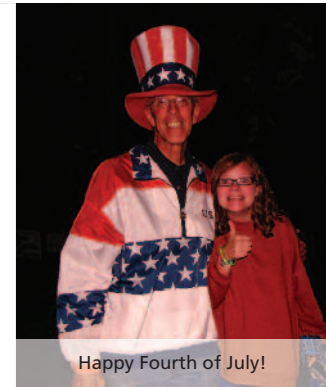

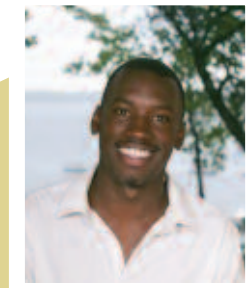

camp expectations

HOW WILL I ARRIVE AT CAMP?

FLYING: your parents will see you off on the plane and then at the Minneapolis Airport. One of our staff wearing a Camp Lincoln & Camp Lake Hubert Shirt and usually holding a Camp Sign will meet you when you get off the plane. Our staff will stay with you and help you get to our chartered buses for a short trip (about 2 ½ hours) to Camp. **BUS:** from the Twin Cities area, you will board the bus at Concord School in Edina and then head up to Camp (about a 2 hour drive). **CAR:** you and your parents will arrive between 1 p.m. and 5 p.m. Please feel free to walk around Camp with them so they can see all of the great things you will be doing!

Once you arrive, you will:

- Meet your cabin staff
- Call your parents
- Settle in and meet the other campers in your cabin

HOW DO MY FAMILY AND FRIENDS KEEP IN TOUCH WITH ME?

- They can send letters or postcards. Also, please do not forget to bring stationary, postcards and stamps of your own to write to them, too.

- Please remember that we encourage mail, but discourage packages.

WHO WILL BE IN MY CABIN?

You will be with campers who have just completed about the same grade as you have and who come from areas all over this country or the world, so you can start to make a group of new friends right away. There are also four or five of our great staff who live right in the cabin with you and are there to make sure you feel safe and to help you have a really fun and great time while at camp. Campers attending for four weeks will be in different cabins than campers coming for two weeks. Tennis and Golf Campers have their own cabins, too!

HOW DO I CHOOSE MY ACTIVITIES?

Once you get to camp, your staff will help you choose and sign up for activities (up to four each day), which are repeated for three days in a row. Then, you will have another chance to sign up for the same activities or a whole new set of activities for the next three days. It is a great system that allows you to learn new things and then continue, or try something else for the next three days. Start thinking now about what you might want to sign up for on the first day...Summer will be here before we know it!
