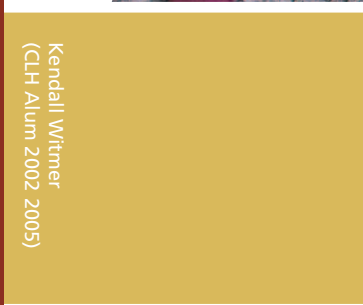

CAMP LINCOLN DEDICATION...

Camp Lincoln has a long tradition of providing an enriching environment for boys and men. This environment allows them to play, learn, and gain life-skills in a setting that appeals to their natural desire for a level of community, purpose and competition. Community, Excellence, Fun, Personal Growth & Development and Quality Relationships are the values that create this environment. We use the Camp Values to guide us in our actions, our speech and our approach to all that we do at Camp.

Our Camp Community begins at the cabin. The cabin is the base, with the boys eating together and spending most evenings and quiet times with one other there. Each cabin can hold up to 18 boys and has a feeling of a home, with three sleeping areas, a den-like center room and a fireplace. The cabin creates the feeling of "family" that is essential and welcoming to each and every camper.

Living with the boys are four cabin staff. The staff members, like the campers, come from all around the country and all over the world. The staff members provide a healthy variety of adult role models that work hard to foster the supportive atmosphere Camp is known for. Each year, the dedication, skills, and exhaustive efforts that the staff put into working with our campers amazes me. This summer has been no exception.

The supportive community also helps to foster camp Quality Relationships. Camp Friends Are Best – CFAB – is an often heard saying among campers and staff. With much land to explore and activities and adventures to experience together, the bonds between campers grow strong quickly. Spending 24 hours a day together at Camp, free from the distractions of the outside world, is like an immersion experience in friendship building.

Of course, having Fun with all those camp friends is a big part of Camp! There is the traditional type of fun, such as playing sports, or trying one or more of our 30 land and water activities. Then there is the time is set aside for free play, or simply hanging out. Too, there are the more unusual fun activities that only happen at camp: The B.O.G., Jell-O Bowl, talent shows, and of course, Color Wars! Where else but at Camp can these fun events occur?

The Camp Achievement Clubs help foster Excellence as well as Personal Growth and Development, while tapping into boys' natural competitiveness and desire to be a part of something bigger than themselves. The achievement clubs require an increasing skill level in a wide variety of activities at Camp. 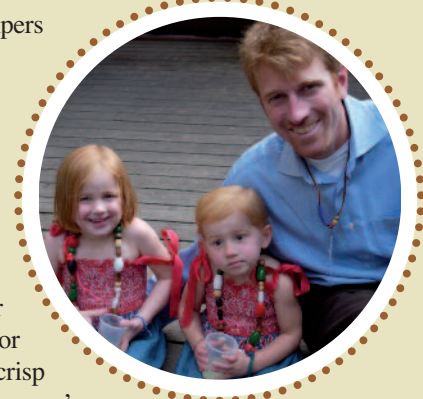
commemorated our legacy. Over the summer, some 1,268 campers and 198 staff helped celebrate 100 years.

Our Core Values, which function as our foundation, have allowed the camps to build an environment of nurture, challenge and character building, while at the same time honoring the fundamental differences between boys and girls and men and women. As children grow, boys and girls thrive in quite different environments and at camp we take these differences and design our facilities and activities around them. For example, the expansive athletic field at Camp Lincoln is a testament to the male wiring of active play with room to run, surrounded by forested paths narrow and winding – Can't you just imagine two young Camp Lincoln Campers blazing a new trail through the forest in a game of Catch-me-if-you-can?!

Camp Lake Hubert's wide and direct paths allow for a gaggle of girls to talk and connect in a different way, and build those extraordinary relationships that last a lifetime. At both camps, kids get to be kids: running, playing, having fun in a safe environment. Some specific Camp Lake Hubert Activities are stilts, hammocks, swings and stacking cups. At Camp Lincoln and Camp Lake Hubert, we strive to build a WHOLE BEING in each camper and staff. I received an email in late August from a mom whose daughter was in her 5th summer at Camp Lake Hubert this summer.

Mom wrote: Julia is still basking in the glow of camp! It's a beautiful thing. I have wanted to send you a letter explaining just how critically pivotal CLH has been for Julia these past several years. You can't begin to imagine how you have transformed our beautiful child into a whole being by providing her with a healthy emotional environment that does not exist at her school and therefore the majority of her life. It is something that no amount of money and no amount of love, support and nurturing from her family can give her. She fuels herself daily with the "carrot of camp" at the end of a long year of school.

This is just one of the many, many stories that remind us what Camp Lincoln and Camp Lake Hubert have done for staff and campers alike over these 100 years.

Our intentional focus on the core values, the gender differences between boys and girls/men and women, and building a whole being is our past, our present and our future. As we enter the next century of camping excellence, Camp Lincoln and Camp Lake Hubert will continue to be intentional about building an environment of diversity through camperships. We will stay updated on the trends in youth development yet maintain our traditional character. We will continue reinvesting in our facilities. This Legacy Sports Building is just such an example of the ways we have dreamed and planned for the future of Camp Lincoln and Camp Lake Hubert as we move into the next 100 years.

BROWNIE COTE 1900-1991

- Brownie grew up in the Mankato, MN Area.
- Attended Carlton College and during the summers worked as a counselor for Blake Camp.
- Earned his Masters in Economics and attended Yale Law School.
- Purchased Blake Camp in 1923 and changed the name to Camp Lincoln the next season.
- In 1926, Brownie hired Drake University sports hero, Chuck Everett.
- Opened Camp Lake Hubert in 1927 with Grace Rogers as director. Dr. William and Grace's son, Fred Rogers, joined the team in the mid thirties.
- Brownie married Julia Thorpe in 1931.
- Brownie and Julia had five children: Randy, Bob, Mary, Bo and Sam, all who spent their summers at camp.
- Brownie purchased Grand View Lodge in 1937, to serve parents of campers and foresaw growth in Minnesota's Tourism Industry.
- In the late 40s, the team purchased a dude ranch in Arizona, to keep key employees on the payroll through the winter. Desert Willow Ranch and then Tanque Verde Ranch, in Tucson, helped expand the business.
- Brownie was involved in the business throughout his life.
- Brownie loved his summer home at Camp Lincoln; where his career began.

SCHOLARSHIPS...

Throughout the 100 Year Anniversary, alumni expressed their enthusiasm for the diversity of campers at camp. Many alumni commented that having shared a cabin with campers from all over the country – and all over the world – made an important and lasting impression on their overall camp experience. We need and want diversity among our camp population each summer as it enriches the camp experience. Diversity comes in a variety of forms including geographic, cultural & ethnic, and socio-economic diversity. One way we increase our diversity is through the Scholarship Fund.

The Camp Lincoln and Camp Lake Hubert Scholarship Fund was started in 1981 upon the death of Chuck Everett, our long-time director and partner with, Brownie Cote and Fred Rogers. Camp Families have continued to donate to the fund, allowing camp to provide financial support to a growing number of families who understand the value of a good camp experience, but did not have the resources to make it happen. The Camps have also been able to focus on creating a more ethnically and socio-economically diverse community, which enriches the camp experience for all. Since the beginning of the scholarship fund, the Camps have matched all contributions, thus expanding the program's outreach.

After coming to camp via a "campership", a camper wrote a thank you note. He ended the very appreciative letter with the words, "Camp is the best thing that ever happened to me, and probably ever will". Brownie was known for saying "Lucky me!" and he was right. How fortunate are we to be part of something that gives children an experience so wonderful, so amazing, that they cannot imagine anything topping the experience? To be able to share these camps with yet another generation of campers is an honor and a privilege. We are lucky.

**CHUCK EVERETT
DIRECTOR OF CAMP LINCOLN AND
CAMP LAKE HUBERT (1903-1981)**

- Counselor-Director-Friend-Athlete
- Joined the Camp Lincoln and Camp Lake Hubert Team in 1926 as a Counselor.
- In 1929, Brownie offered him a Full-Time Position as an Associate Camp Director.
- First Manager of Triangle W Ranch until it sold in the mid 1950's.
- Was known as Mr. PR, he was a photographer, producer, editor and projectionist for all of the "Camp Movies."
- Chuck was named Drake's Athlete of the Century.
- Four-Sport Letterman Athlete at Drake University.
- Chuck was director for 41 years until he retired in 1970.
- Even after retirement, Chuck spent every summer at camp and he maintained an office in the lodge at the center of camp.

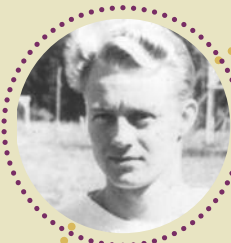

FRED ROGERS 1912-2006

- Born in 1912 in South Dakota to a Baptist Minister who loved to fish.
- Fred's family summered on Lake Hubert in Minnesota.
- Fred started working in the kitchen at Camp Lincoln at the early age of 14. He loved the whole camp experience and was a "natural" for working with kids and staff.
- His mother, Grace Rogers, was hired as the first Director of Camp Lake Hubert and held that position for nearly 30 years, so camp was certainly in his blood.
- In the mid-thirties, Brownie and Chuck hired him full time, and the trio became a strong force in the camping world.
- Fred and his wife, Marlys, had three boys, who also grew up in the camp setting.
- Fred was active in the American Camp Association (ACA), locally and nationally, serving as the National President from 1959-60. He received ACA's highest recognition - Distinguished Service Award.
- He was a long time Rotarian, serving as President of his club and then as District Governor for a term.
- When Fred retired from active management of the camps in the 80s, he and Marlys returned each summer to their cabin at camp, where Fred served as Alumni Coordinator.

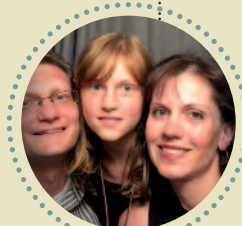

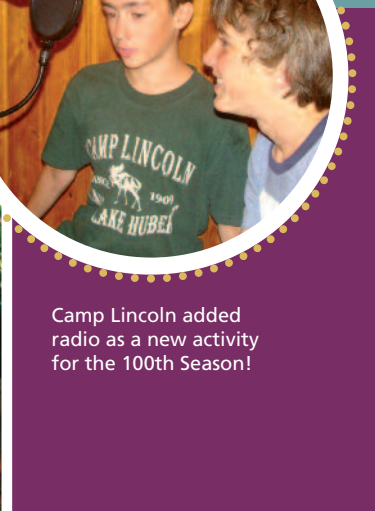

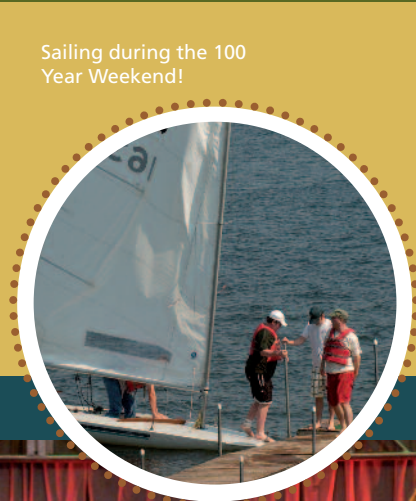

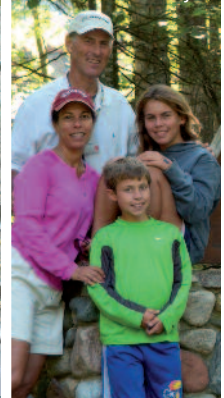

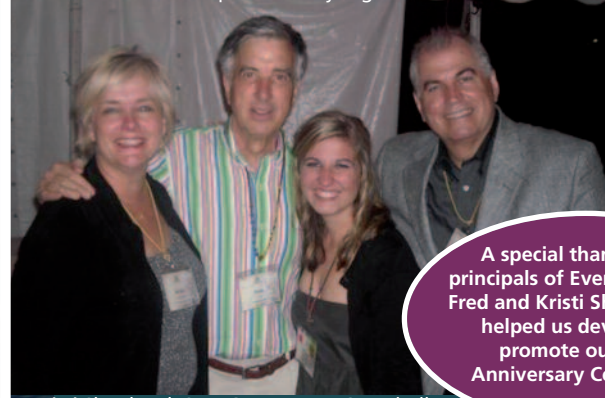

ELSI DODGE'S FAMILY STORY

I visited and stayed with my grandmother, Willie Wilson, when I was very young, and then was a camper and Counselor in Training from 1957-1966.

Ralph Wilson, my grandfather, had been an Army Officer, then a physical education teacher in the St. Louis, MO, Public Schools.

One of the PE subjects (unlikely as it sounds today) was riflery. In 1934, he accepted the job of Riflery Director

at Camp Lincoln. He and my grandmother lived in the Armory Cabin at Lincoln. He was known as Chief and helped design what we now call the Chief Wilson Rifle Range, and my grandmother was known as Willie.

Willie directed the Rifle Program at Hubert. Their daughter (my mother) was Molly Jean Wilson, known as the "Papoose" (because her father was the Chief) and she was called Poosey. She was a camper and counselor at Hubert. Of course, she was an Expert Rifleman, with many trophies from competitions.

Mother made a little extra money chaperoning campers on the train from St. Louis to Camp each summer. Often I would go along, and we would stay in Granny's Cabin at Lincoln. I rode my first horse there at the age of three.

Willie continued to live in the cabin summers after Chief (Wilson) died in 1946, and she was Riflery Director at Hubert. I too earned my Expert in riflery and participated in competitions and earned trophies and medals as well.

Our rifle program was always good, but when "Chief" Wilson and his wife "Willie", came to us, it was not "better" but "best". Under their supervision, many fine shooters were developed, and just this summer a new rifle range was dedicated to "Chief's" memory. Our campers at Camp Lincoln and Camp Lake Hubert have been national champions of rifle teams, and some have won honors in shoulder to shoulder matches with men in different parts of the country.

PEGGY VARNEY TELLS HER FAMILY HISTORY IN AN EMAIL AUGUST 22, 2009

I go way way back - 1925 to be exact when I was just 4 years old. So, you see I am an old lady now, but full of memories of both camps - Lincoln almost more than CLH. My family started at camp when my father, Russell Varney (known as Uncle by everyone) was hired to build a Sailing Program for CL. He designed and built many of the boats we had in the fleet in those days. As a director of the program the camp provided a cabin for our family on camp property, so my mother was there also, but was not on the staff. As I said, I was very young in the early days of our time at camp, but as I grew up, I learned to sail in a little 12-foot sloop my Dad built for me. I was not officially a camper since I lived on the grounds with my parents, but I sailed all over Lake Hubert in my little boat known as the "Atom". When I was older, I went to CLH, which was started several years (don't remember the exact year) after we had started at Lincoln. At the start I was a camper in the Senior Camp. In the meantime, my

dad had established a sailing program at CLH soon after it opened, and I became an instructor in the program during my years in the Counselor in Training Program. During my college years and for many following years, I worked as Head of the Sailing program at CLH, and my dad and I worked as a team keeping the programs going at both camps. During all those years my dad, "Uncle," was designing, building, and launching boats one after the other in Lake Hubert. One year, we had a fleet of 25 or 30 boats and many of them were designed and built by Uncle. Uncle died in 1950 while at camp and I continued with the program for another 5 years, before deciding it was time to do something different. My friend, Katie (Lundholm), who is helping me get to the celebration, was one of the best sailing instructors I had on my staff.

So, we are both looking forward to coming to the celebration and reliving some of our memories of some very special days and some very special people at Lake Hubert. We remember with fondness Brownie and Judy Cote, Chuck and Madge Everett, Fred and Marlys Rogers, and Fred's Parents, Dr. and Mrs. Rogers. It will be great to get together with the younger members of those special families and see the work you are doing now to continue the excellent traditions of the Lake Hubert Minnesota Camps.

We were fortunate in having a man like "Uncle" Varney as sailing instructor for many years, and how secure we felt in his care. At this time, Peggy was a small child, but even then was deeply interested in sailboats, not under her father's tutelage because the fine sailor she is today. "Uncle" was not only a sailing instructor, but also supervised the building of many of the sailboats we are using today. These boats are like a memorial to "Uncle" who meant so much to us. Not only that, but the hull was another of his projects, and was so christened at a formal ceremony by Mrs. Varney, who chose its name.
