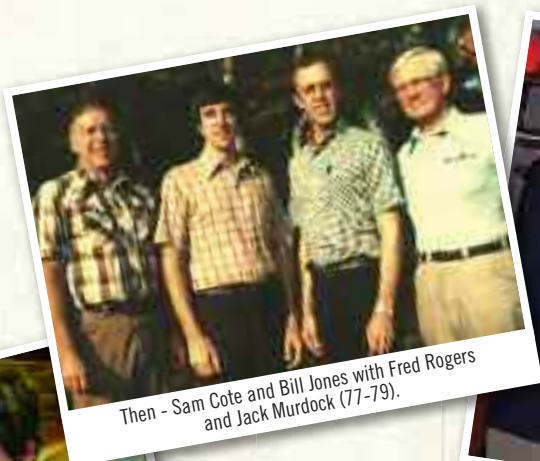

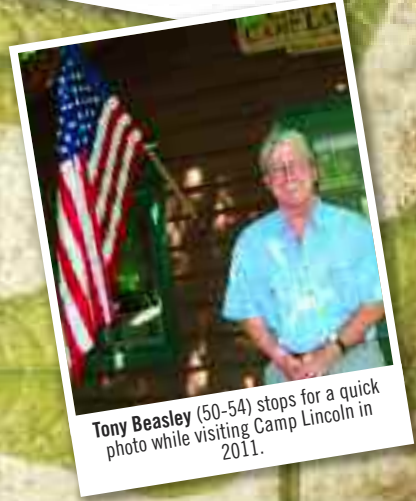

Our Scholarship Fund was initiated in 1981 as a tribute to long-time director, Chuck Everett. Since then, alumni and camp parents have continued to support this fund through annual giving, and often as memorials to camp friends who have passed on. The Scholarship Fund has been a blessing for many campers over the years, and we are pleased and honored to facilitate this opportunity. The fund is managed through the American Camp Association (ACA), with specific criteria required by ACA and the camps, prior to receiving campership funds. All donations are matched by the camps and are fully tax deductible through the ACA, a 501c3 organization.

This past summer, the camps provided financial support for 18 boys and 15 girls, of all ages and from eight states. As you read from some of the enclosed testimonials, the opportunity to experience "camp" as we know it can be a life-changing experience.

Other Upgrades in 2011-2012

- Our three week camp was also new last summer and was a great option for those campers whose busy summer schedule may not allow for attending one of our four or eight week sessions. The session offers our traditional well-rounded approach to the camp experience, with plenty of activity choices, as well as the opportunity to participate in some of the canoeing, hiking, backpacking and other adventure trips.
- Remodeling of Mohawk Cabin is underway and will include an expanded bathroom, more spacious cubbies for all three chalets, and a new upper chalet stairway with a fun covered deck area. The charm of our traditional cabins remains, just with a few good tweaks that HGTV would approve of. All CLH cabins have been remodeled, with only Bunkhouse and Pioneer Cabins remaining at Camp Lincoln.
- Six new salad bar coolers arrived just in time for the Opening Day of camp. Campers, staff and the food service support team loved them. A variety of fresh greens and salad offerings were featured for lunch and dinner, with lots of toppings and dressing choices.
- We have added tapaderos to our saddles for their protection and safety features. They protect feet when riding through brush and wooded areas, and also keep feet from slipping through the stirrup.

Continuing the legacy of excellence in program and facilities...

Under the supervision of and creative design of Bill Jones and staff member, Colin Macalindin, the **Bouldering Wall** was started in September 2011 and will be completed by May 2012. It is 78 feet long, 10 feet high, has an internal and external corner, two challenging overhangs and multiple routes.

One of the hottest beach activities around the world is called **Standup Paddle Boarding** – SUP for short. CLH started the trend last summer with great success and the program will be introduced to Camp Lincoln this summer. It's a great sport for balance and body coordination.

Trapshooting at CL and CLH continues to be very popular. Two new 20 gauge Remington Pump Action 870's and a Remington Over/Under were added to the program last season.

Imagine learning to skipper a **38 foot Beneteau Sloop** while sailing among the beautiful Apostle Islands of Lake Superior. This happens each summer, an exciting four day sailing trip on the largest freshwater lake in the USA. It is just one of the many adventure trips that Lincoln campers can choose while at camp. Planning is in the works for a Sailing Trip at CLH also.

In addition to spectacular jumps off the top of the **Swan**, a unique slide was added this past spring. It's fast and fun!

Our **"Podcast"** program is a hit, providing campers the opportunity to create their own digital audio file, incorporating writing, editing, audio and uploading technology.
