# TOM SOLANO ACHIEVES EAGLE CLUB

This summer, we were thrilled to induct a new member into the Camp Lincoln Eagle Club. Tom Solano, age 15, completed all the requirements for the Eagle Club, and the whole camp participated in a very special ceremony the night of August 7, 2014.

Tom comes from Akron, Indiana, and is a second generation camper, as his mother **Sarah Baker (1972-1975, 1977-1978)** attended Camp Lake Hubert for six summers in the 1970s. Tom's Great Aunt is **Lois Baker (S1954, 1956-1990)**, who dedicated 36 years of service to Camp Lake Hubert through the 50s, 60s, 70s and 80s. Thus, Tom carries on a very special family legacy.

Like many campers, Tom started his camping adventure with us as a Gopher in 2007. His love for camp was immediate and he continued returning each year, the last four years as an eight-weeker. His drive for achievement and excellence put him on the path to complete the Camp Lincoln Achievement Clubs. The objective of the clubs is to recognize campers who demonstrate positive leadership along with a well-rounded skill-set in all camp activities. Each club is progressive in skill and knowledge within the camp program. During the summer of 2009, Tom completed the requirements for the first level, now called Lincoln Club (formerly Warrior Club) and in 2010 finished his Beaver Club requirements. His Stag Club induction came in 2011, and we knew he would take the challenge to meet the tough requirements of Eagle Club, which encompass the highest skill level in all the camp activities. No easy task. For the next two summers, Tom worked hard to complete those skills, and he did so early last summer. Of equal importance, an Eagle Candidate must embody the full measure of the camp's core

values and camp creed, demonstrating leadership and character qualities in all aspects of the camp community. Tom was honored as Color Wars Captain for the Blue Team First Session in 2014 (and his team was victorious). He also received the prestigious Brownie Cote Award during the Second Session Final Campfire. Campers and staff alike recognized Tom as a true leader.

The Eagle Ceremony was a special event, held in the center area of camp with all campers and staff joining Tom in congratulating him on this important achievement. Our camp history records indicate that Tom is the 17th Eagle in camp's 105 year history. **Congratulations to Tom Solano!**



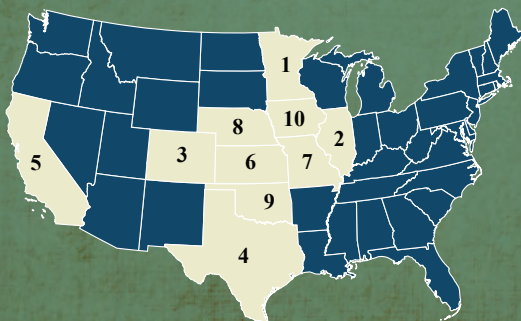

# SCHOLARSHIP FUND CAMP LINCOLN AND CAMP LAKE HUBERT

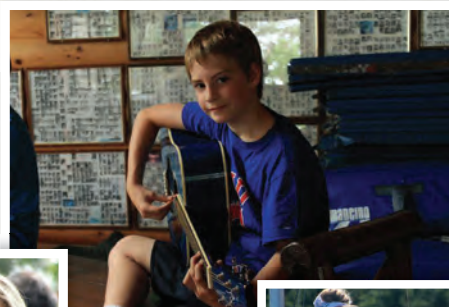

# LEADERSHIP TRAINING REFLECTIONS CAMP LINCOLN

I have been going to Camp Lincoln for about 10 years. It all began when my cousin Nate and I signed up for the two week session in 2005. We were only seven or eight, and were in the Gopher Cabin

with other campers our age. I distinctly remember that first summer because about a week in, I got terribly homesick and started to write my parents asking to go home. The camp counselors that summer were awesome. I remember how one counselor from England talked to me about how he sometimes got homesick too, and helped to get me engaged in camp activities. Suddenly, I found myself missing home less and enjoying all the cool activities at Lincoln. What is so remarkable to me is that despite my initial discomfort with going to camp, I quickly came to love the Camp Lincoln experience. I found myself eager to come back year after year, until eventually, I began the Leadership Training Program two summers ago.

When I reflect on my camp experience as a whole, I see not only a journey of physical, mental, and moral development, but also a journey of lasting friendships, adventures, and incredible memories. Camp has offered me the opportunity to pursue activities that, before camp, were foreign to me, such as sailing. The next year, when I was able to come back for the first year of the Leadership Training (LT) Program, I was once again so excited to return to camp. Old friends, such as Alec and David, also participated in the LT Program, and I also got to meet so many new faces. The LT1 Program was tough and demanding, and through our rigorous responsibilities, we learned a lot about ourselves as both leaders and as individuals. This past summer, I felt especially fortunate to be able to come back to Camp Lincoln for the second year of the LT Program.

The second year, much like the first, was very demanding in its workload, and required us to develop great time management skills. The second year was different, however, because LT2 is in a strange middle ground between a camper and counselor and, as such, an LT2 has the ability to make great friends with both. LT2s are also there for six weeks and get to meet campers from other sessions, which I enjoyed because it broadened my perception of camp and allowed me to engage as a leader in a whole different setting where I knew almost none of the campers. Camp Lincoln is remarkable in its ability to foster relationships between people from all over the United States and the world. I had never met the other LT2s before this past summer, but in just the short few weeks we had together at camp, we became friends. Now that camp has ended, I often text my fellow LT2s to catch up or make plans to get together in the future.

One of the big changes transitioning from an LT1 and LT2 was the way in which LT2s get to interact with the campers. As an LT2, you live in a cabin with the campers functioning almost in the role of a counselor. I loved this. Living in the cabin, you get to develop better relationships with the campers and counselors you work with and participate in all the cabin activities. There is nothing more fun than being around excited young campers. You get to spend rest hour with them, play an intense games of roof ball with them during Free Swim, and get to know them even better during meals.

The Leadership Training Program at Camp Lincoln is an experience that I will always remember and value. I believe the program is about trying to find people that have the potential to be strong leaders, but still have areas in which to develop to blossom into their full potential. One of the greatest developments I gained from the LT Program was a growth in maturity that was realized through the increased perseverance through challenges, the ability to recognize my weaknesses and the humbleness to address them and ask for help when I needed it. The skills that I learned in the program have already proven to be invaluable in other aspects of my life. I have found that regardless of the setting, be it socially, academically, or athletically, the LT Program has prepared me to strive for excellence and leadership. I am so glad to have had the opportunity to participate in the program and find myself unable to truly express the appreciation I feel to André and the other members of Camp Lincoln Staff, for the investment that they have made to develop such an impressive program. 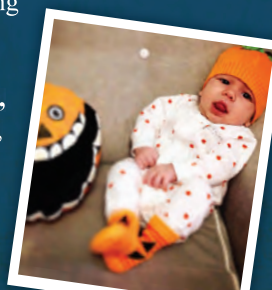
