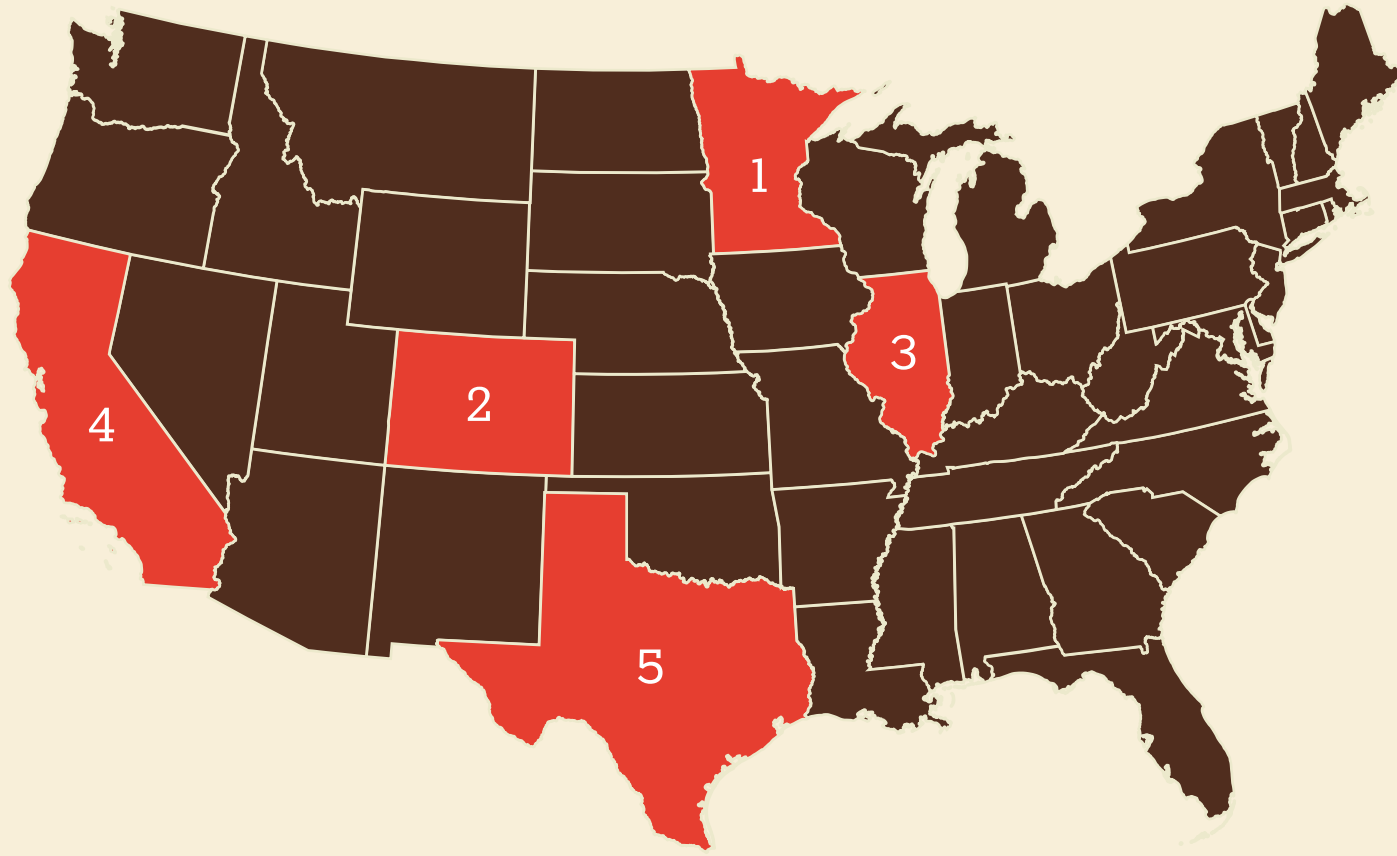

Years at camp: 5 Age: 13

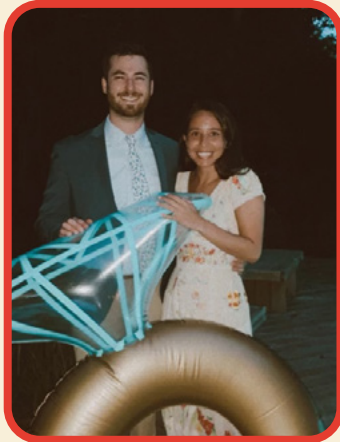

Dr. Elizabeth White (C2000-2005, S2007-2008) and her husband Seth welcomed their first son, Oliver William White.

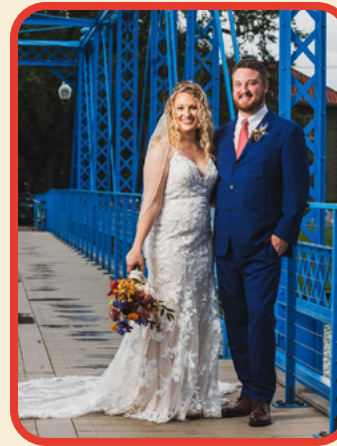


Madi Burns (S2012-2013) and John Pouchot (S2013), who met at camp in 2013, got married in September. Michael Badum was in attendance.
