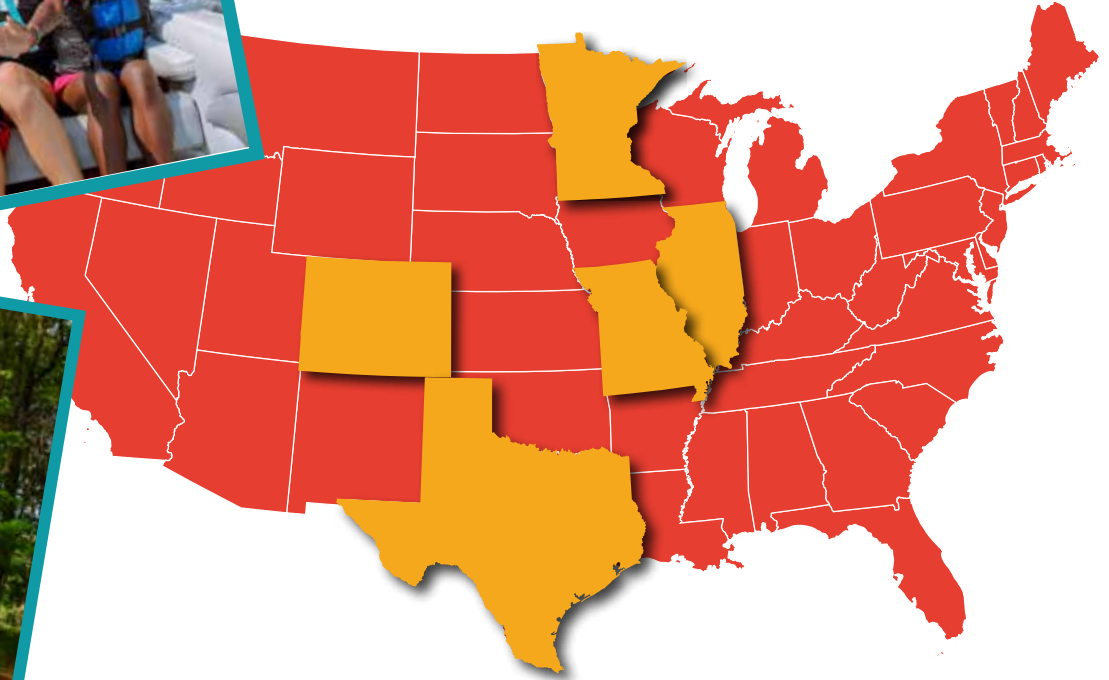

LT REFLECTION HASTINGS BRISLIN

I came to camp for the first time in the Summer of 2018. I was the fourth generation in my family to attend camp and I was super excited. I was also stoked to get out of the summer heat in my hometown of Phoenix, Arizona. Camp was the first time I was away from my parents. I was pretty nervous the first few days. Once I became comfortable at camp I fell in love with it. I loved hanging out with my friends, going to my favorite activities such as sailing and waterskiing, and having meals with my cabin. Some of my closest camp friends today are from my first year and we still talk to this day.

My mom was a long-time camper and LT at Camp Lake Hubert. I knew a little about her experience as an LT. I did not know much about the Camp Lincoln LT Experience. During my Senior Year at camp, I did talk to the LTs. They each said that the program was not easy and it was very beneficial to their development as a person and as a leader. A couple of months after camp ended I received an email from André about the program and then I applied. I was thrilled when I was accepted to be an LT for the Second Session of Summer 2023.

There were six guys in my LT Group and I was very close with all of them as campers as we were in the same cabin for the last two years. We were all friends when we got to camp for the start of the LT Program. However, during the month, we became an even more tightly bonded group spending hours together every day planning events and writing papers together.

We were given a lot of responsibility during the LT Program. During the session, we were assigned many tasks that needed to be completed throughout the session. The task that left a lasting impact on me was our journals. For the journals, each one of us would read the articles that were on topics such as bullying and role modeling. After we would read the article, we would discuss the subject matter with one another and then write a journal about the importance of what we read and how we could incorporate it during our time at Camp Lincoln as leaders. The journals were also very important for us in our role of supporting the counselors in the cabins. Each LT was assigned to a cabin where he would spend time throughout the session. While in the cabin with the campers, LTs had to know how to deal with some of the situations we discussed in our journals.

Another very rewarding experience as an LT was planning special days. As a camper, special days were the best days at camp and where I created many memories. I wanted to make the special days this summer as memorable for the campers as they were for me. Our group of LTs spent a lot of time working together to plan the day. One valuable lesson I learned on special days was how to problem-solve. When something did not go as planned, we had to work together as a group and fix the problem at hand so that the day could go smoothly. Finally, as an LT, the campers really looked up to us. This meant that we had to be excellent role models and embody the Camp Creed wherever we were at camp.

I am so grateful that I was able to complete the LT Program. I learned many lessons that allowed me to grow as a person and as a leader. Personally, I became a better public speaker. At the beginning of the session, public speaking was my biggest fears. By the end of the session, it became natural to me. I also became a better time manager. There was so much on my plate every day as an LT. I was forced to manage my time wisely because there was only so much time in a day and in a session. One moment that stuck with me from my time at camp was on my last day. I was getting picked up by my parents and I was saying my goodbyes to my LT friends and camp staff members. That is when a camper that I spent a lot of time with came over and gave me a big hug. He did not want to let go and he said he did not want me to leave. This really showed me that I had a very, positive impact on the campers and made me proud of what I had done as an LT. I was so happy that I was able to give these campers a summer that they will always remember.

My experience as an LT was unforgettable. While there certainly was much work to be done every single day and night, I was able to balance time spent doing work for the LT Program and time having fun with my lifelong friends, which made the experience so much fun. I was able to form deeper bonds with my lifelong camp friends and learn how to collaborate better with my peers.

Since I have returned from camp, I have regularly seen the habits and skills I developed in the LT Program show themselves in day-to-day life. As LTs, we were required to complete paperwork in our free time around daily activities, cabin stays, and running events, so I learned to take advantage of my time much more efficiently and how to avoid procrastination. Additionally, I have become much better at organizing my documents and papers, and I do a much better job of keeping track of due dates in school. At camp, with quickly approaching deadlines, organization, priorities, and time management was essential to our success. I had always been a good writer, but the demand of the work in the LT Program helped me get comfortable producing quality work even without plentiful time to complete it. This year in school, I have had to write several timed writes and other essays, and I have been able to write more efficiently because I am more confident in my writing skills. Finally, outside of my school, on my rowing team, I have applied the leadership qualities we studied as well as lessons that I learned on my own through cabin stays and special events. I have become a better leader on my team by working hard to be helpful in every way I can and to encourage productive conversation among all members of the team, especially when stress or tensions are high in a competitive scenario. This has helped me enjoy my position of leadership on my team so much more than I had previously, and it has also helped me gain the respect and trust of my team.

The most memorable camp event that I planned was Color Wars Part II. Since my first year at camp, that was my favorite event of all, and as a Senior Camper, I was fortunate enough to lead the Blue Team to a Color Wars Victory! Because of this, I knew I wanted the day to be amazing so that the younger campers, seniors, and team captains could get the same great experiences that I had during my six years at camp. The planning for the day was a long and tedious task, but the day ran smoothly and the 5 LTs involved all did an excellent job at making everything happen exactly as it was intended. This event was also the final special day that the LTs oversaw planning, so the success of the day made all of us feel so accomplished and proud of our hard work over the course of the session.

I am so grateful for the summer I spent as an LT. I was able to learn a lot about myself, my friends, work habits, and most importantly, leadership. I thoroughly enjoyed spending time on the staff member side of Camp Lincoln, and I look forward to considering a job as a staff member soon. I will certainly miss Camp Lincoln and all the wonderful people and memories there, but I will forever remember them and the lessons they taught me.



LT REFLECTION HAILEY BERGESON

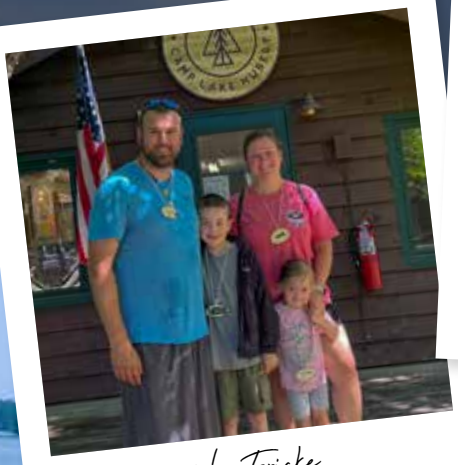
Camp Lake Hubert has been my second home since I was seven years old. The core values that are heavily embodied and upheld throughout the community help every camper grow into a graceful, strong minded, persistent, and adventurous woman. The best personal testimony I can offer to explain this point comes from my time spent as an LT. Having the opportunity to grow in a supportive environment while learning about leadership and giving back to my community has been one of the greatest blessings of my life. As an LT 2, I spent time in three different cabins, helping to oversee their daily activities along with my other LT expectations. Throughout the summer, my camper's read me the stories of their lives as I introduced them to my happy place. I brought them sailing on the windy lake and taught them to skipper the boats on calm days. We made paper from recycled scraps in the old ecology shed while we kept our eyes out for the baby frogs. I would sit and make bracelets with them until we lost track of time. As I spent more time with these girls, they revealed their bright souls to me, and it became a full-circle moment as I remembered my own magical connections with my LTs when I was a camper. As the summer came to a close, I made them promise never to forget the love that waits for them on the shores of Lake Hubert. I keep an oil pastel drawing taped above my nightstand. A picture of the classic camp sunset, one of my campers drew me the picture with the promise that she would return the next summer. A small clay creation from another one of my campers sits on my desk and reminds me of the connections that can be made simply by practicing compassion. One of the bracelets I was given was especially meaningful, and I wear it on my wrist every day. I read the letters they left me to remind myself that every action I take can make an impact. Understanding the influence I made on these girls made me realize that every child needs someone to look up to, to give them advice, and to encourage them to realize their capabilities. I am thankful I got to give back to my summer home and be that person for the girls I met last summer. They delivered me to my passion of working with kids and taught me to understand the gift of being a leader to a child. I carry pieces of them with me every day. Besides the material things they left me, I carry their thankfulness, sensitivity, thoughtful words, and curious nature. I carry them with me, they carry me with them, and we all carry the love of Camp Lake Hubert.
